




THE FOURTH TRANSNATIONAL PROJECT MEETING

SUSTAINABLE SERVICE IN DS

INVOLVING PERSONS WITH DOWN SYNDROME IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS THROUGH SERVICE LEARNING

Despite all the pandemic restrictions, during the 22nd and 23rd of April 2022, the Sustainable Service in DS Consortium keeps working on the training program dedicated to involving people with Down syndrome and other intellectual disabilities in becoming active actors of change for a better world. The meeting was planned face to face in Larissa, Greece and it should have been called the fourth transnational project meeting. In fact, it represents the 11th on-line project management meeting in a period of 15 months.



The sustained efforts of all the members of the Consortium are beginning to produce tangible outcomes. Seven Service-Learning Training Activities (SLTAs) and their afferent Training Materials (TM) have been produced in the framework of Intellectual Output 2 (IO2) and Intellectual Output 3 (IO3).

The first main topic of the meeting was to Train the Trainer for Training Activities (SLTA1 - SLTA7 - IO2) and the afferent Training Materials (TM - IO3). In this respect, all the partners prepared the content of SLTAs and TM. It was for the first time when a whole content of the SSinDS training program was on the table.

The training took place in the chronological order of SLTAs. The training activities and afferent training materials were simultaneously presented for each stage of the training process. Each


